Recently, a homeless woman walked into our shelter at Noah's Ark and stole a little tortie kitten named Rum Raisin. When Sharon, our volunteer on duty, realized what had happened, she raced out to look for them.

She drove to every homeless hangout but couldn't find them. She filed a report with BSO and then cried and prayed a lot!!! She felt horrible because she knew that this woman could not take care of Rum Raisin.

The following day we received a call that a homeless woman with a kitten was at a gas station on Federal Highway. So we got Rum Raisin back and LIFE IS GOOD! And Rum Raisin was adopted by one of the families that was at the shelter when she was stolen!
